A TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION EVENT WITH OUR INDIGENOUS NEIGHBOURS FROM SAUGEEN SHORES AND CAPE CROKER



MONDAY, JUNE 18, 2018

AT KINCARDINE UNITED CHURCH IN THE FELLOWSHIP HALL

Set aside an evening to learn more about our Indigenous neighbours and our history with them. A Blanket Exercise will be led by indigenous leaders to build understanding about our shared history as Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples in Canada by walking through pre-contact, treaty-making, colonization and resistance. By engaging on an emotional and intellectual level, the Blanket Exercise effectively educates and increases empathy. Come and dive deeply into the first steps of reconciliation. You will be changed.

TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION CALLS TO ACTION

The United Church of Canada actively participated in the Residential School Settlement Agreement in which thousands of indigenous children were ripped from their families — forced to stop speaking their language, to forsake their culture, to deny their spirituality, to endure terrible privation and to suffer abuse of all kinds to "take the Indian out of the child." We were horribly wrong. The United Church apologized in 1986 and again in 1998. In 1988, part of the response from the Native People of the All Native Circle Conference stated, "[we] hope and pray that the Apology is not symbolic but that these are the words of action and sincerity."

In 2015 the Canadian Truth and Reconciliation Commission issued its report. At the end of the report, 94 "Calls to Action" were crafted "In order to redress the legacy of residential schools and advance the process of Canadian reconciliation." The United Church of Canada's General Council in 2015 affirmed all 94 "Calls to Action" as our collective direction for sincere action. Over coming weeks, we will be featuring one or two of those "Calls to Action" as part of our own congregation's active and sincere movement into healing. It is but a start on a generations long journey of reconciliation. (see next page)

We call upon leaders of the church parties to the Settlement Agreement and all other faiths, in collaboration with Indigenous spiritual leaders, Survivors, schools of theology, seminaries, and other religious training centres, to develop and teach curriculum for all student clergy, and all clergy and staff who work in Aboriginal communities, on the need to respect Indigenous spirituality in its own right, the history and legacy of residential schools and the roles of the church parties in that system, the history and legacy of religious conflict in Aboriginal families and communities, and the responsibility that churches have to mitigate such conflicts and prevent spiritual violence.
