





EVERYDAY SKEPTICS ... We often ask ourselves the question "So What?" when it comes to spiritual growth. RESOURCE ROOM ARCHIVAL RECORDS



Thousands of pages of records have been created during the 168 years of Kincardine United Church's existence. Original archival records are securely stored and accessible at the United Church's Archives facility at 40 Oak Street, Toronto. Many Kincardine United Church documents recently transferred to the Archives have been digitized. Searchable digital copies of these documents are available on the desktop PC in the Resource Room. These records include items such as Annual Reports (1970 – present), Committee, Board & Council meeting minutes (1977 – 2010), UCW General, Executive & Unit meeting minutes (1979-2015). Much of our recent history is contained within these archival documents,

bearing witness to our acts and decisions and serving as the memory of our church. A good reminder of the importance of the records we create today, which become the history of tomorrow. "People must know the past to understand the present and face the future." Nellie McClung



BEFORE CHURCH COFFEE - every Sunday


People are needed to prepare the coffee, hot water for tea, set out the cups, milk, tea, cream and sugar on the trolley and get it all upstairs for 10:00 am, return everything to the kitchen at some point during the service (preferably during a hymn so as not to interfere with the service and clean up the trolley. *Time commitment: one person about 25 minutes to get it all ready and about 10 minutes to clean up.*

LOAVES AND FISHES POTLUCK – second Monday of the month

On the second Monday of every month a potluck is held for all members of the congregation, friends, acquaintances and family to attend. Assistance is needed in setting up the tables, getting coffee etc ready and then cleaning up after. There are often people who came to the dinner who will stay and help with the clean up. *Time commitment: set up takes about one to one and half hours and clean up is about an hour depending on how many people help.*

SUNDAE SUNDAY – first Sunday of the month after Church

On the first Sunday of the month ice cream sundaes are served after Church. This is



fun event and easy to set up and clean up after. Set up includes putting out the "fixings", bowls, spoons, setting up coffee and tea and cleaning up after. *Time commitment: about the same amount of time as setting up for after-Church coffee.*

MONTHLY STEW/SOUP POTLUCK LUNCH – third Sunday of the Month

This new event the Membership and Mission committee is starting Sunday, February 17. This will be a simple potluck – stew and buns one month and soup and buns the next month. Setup will include putting out bowls and plates, silverware, preparing coffee and tea etc, putting out the stews/soups after Church and cleaning up. *Time commitment: one hour set-up and cleanup for 90 minutes maximum.*

MINUTE FOR MISSION

MARCH 3, 2019

DEEPENING MINISTRY

Supervised ministry education is an intentional learning experience that enables people preparing for ministry to deepen their pastoral identity, reflect theologically, and enhance their ministry skills. Mission & Service supports supervised ministry education by providing a grant to a learning site, like a congregation, for an eight-month placement.

The Rev. Maya Braithwaite recently completed a placement at Bloor Street United Church in Toronto, Ontario. One of her goals was learning about social justice in a congregational context.

"Ministry is about relationships. For me, it's about collaborating with others and harnessing the creativity that God has gifted us, while letting it go and flow throughout the church. While at Bloor Street, I had the opportunity to share in the healing work of storytelling that is often involved in social justice work. I experienced what an Affirming church looks like and what an Affirming church does in its day-to-day functions and in worship. I learned about protocol as we welcomed and began the work of supporting a Syrian refugee family. I learned about conflict transformation as we grappled with ways of responding to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's recommendations. I also shared my love for contemplative prayer and a variety of spiritual practices. We danced, journalled, meditated, and the children and I started learning about Godly Play...together."
