

Michael Coren had a profound spiritual and personal change of heart. His book, *Epiphany*, is about how and why his opinion on marriage between same-sex couples changed – the reaction from both sides of the fence; and how the Christian doctrine, when studied closely and without bias, heartily supports Michael's findings. As a middle-aged, very white, very straight, very Christian man, he was obliged, first reluctantly and then eagerly, to explore the complex dynamic between faith and homosexuality and to work out a new narrative. The crux of that narrative: God is love. Honest, brave, and rigorous in its scholarship, Epiphany is a ground-breaking book on one of society's most pressing issues. It has already been widely praised by leading academics and theologians and is published in April 2016.


