
#### SAFE COUNTRY? NOT ANY MORE ...

The United States is no longer a safe country for refugees. "Canadians have seen... how refugees are treated heartlessly in the U.S. under President Trump: children separated from their parents, long-term detention in horrific conditions, criminal prosecution of people just for crossing the border to seek safety, new policies closing the door on women fleeing gender-based violence," said Claire Roque of the Canadian Council for Refugees (a United Church of Canada partner agency). If you wish to take action on this issue, there is a resource with suggestions available at the



back of the worship space to take home and use. These actions are supported by the United Church of Canada and by our Membership and Mission committee.

#### TOP 10 WAYS TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF THE "FLU"

<u>Stay healthy</u> – get an annual flu shot. Drink plenty of liquids. Eat a healthy diet. Exercise regularly. Get enough rest. Decrease Stress.

**Practice hand hygiene** – Using soap and water, lather your hands for at least 20 seconds, especially if you are in contact with infants and small children or when you are handling food.

<u>Cover your coughs and sneezes</u> – use tissues and dispose of them after each use. Do not use the old traditional cotton handkerchief as it is not sanitary.

<u>Sneeze into the crook of your arm</u> – This will prevent germs from spreading through the air.

**Stay home if you are sick** – Take time to rest and avoid spreading the illness to others.

**Keep your distance** – If you are sick, keep a one metre distance from others.


<u>Offer a greeting</u> – If you are concerned about shaking hands, let the person know and offer warm words instead of physical contact.

**<u>Pray</u>** – If you aren't able to go to worship because of illness, take some time to pray for your health and the health of your congregation.

**Phone** – Call family, friends and neighbours when there is a risk that visiting in person might spread illness.

<u>Then there's the money</u> – Virus droplets can survive for up to 24 to 48 hours on hard non-porous surfaces, for 8 to 12 hours on cloth, paper and tissue and for 5 minutes on hands. Money passes through hands that have been many places, so wash your hands often to prevent passing and receiving germs.
