

2018 OFFERING ENVELOPES & PAR ... With the new year only two months away, it's time to begin planning for 2018. For those in the congregation presently using weekly offering envelopes, the envelopes will be available in mid-December. The 2017 envelope number assignments will be updated and changed for 2018, so if you have grown fond of a specific number we can only offer you the promise of change.

If you do not presently use offering envelopes and would like to do so, please contact the Envelope Steward (Rod Coates) or the church office.

Many of the congregation have opted to become Pre-Authorized Remittance (PAR) subscribers. In fact, more members of the congregation now use PAR than offering envelopes. While any time is a good time to consider how you support your church, now is an especially good time as offering envelopes are being assigned and distributed. Some of the advantages of PAR are:

- PAR allows members & adherents to give faithfully to the church even when they are not able to be there in person.
- PAR offerings are transferred automatically to the Kincardine United Church bank account monthly, which makes budgeting and planning easier.
- PAR donations can be changed or cancelled at any time.
- PAR avoids paperwork for the Sunday offering counters and the envelope steward. (Yes, it's all about <u>us</u>, isn't it?) This reduces carbon footprint and management of used offering envelopes, which must be retained for 7 years. There is <u>no</u> paperwork involved once PAR is set up.
- Anytime anyone is up to PAR it's a good thing!

Please consider PAR as one of the ways in which you can support Kincardine United Church.

THANKS FOR YOUR SUGGESTIONS! Earlier this year, Council asked the congregation for suggestions targeting various improvements that would increase the functionality or improve the appearance of our church. Many suggestions were submitted, and Council has subsequently obtained cost estimates for most of these suggestions. The updated Project Wish List will allow Council to allocate funds as they become available and permit members of the congregation to target donations for a project they would like to see completed. This also allows us to manage bequests in accordance with our Memorial Gifts Policy. This list will be updated periodically as projects are completed and new ones are identified.

MINUTE FOR MISSIONS

NOVEMBER 26, 2017

Training Birth Attendants

Our gifts for Mission & Service support midwives and healthy babies and mothers. Let us hear a story from Tanzania about this important work.

Four hundred and ninety-four women from across Tanzania, East Africa, and 16 training sessions in collaboration with the Tanzanian Ministry of Health: these are the latest totals for training traditional birth attendants (midwives) reported by Mission & Service partner the Morogoro Women's Training Centre. The collaboration, which is made possible with the support of United Church Women, is part of an overall strategy to reduce maternal and infant mortality rates in Tanzania.

The women have been named by their community and range in age from early 20s to over 70. Some have worked as traditional birth attendants for decades. Some completed high school, others some grades in elementary school. A few have never attended school. All have developed a wide range of skills on the job and faced many challenges in the course of their career. Some live close to a health clinic or hospital, where they can readily refer high-risk cases. Others live many kilometres from the closest medical centre over difficult and sometimes impassable terrain.

Molen Abdul has been delivering babies for 47 years. She welcomes the additional training and says, "This work is very important to me. It is like it keeps the clock of life ticking."

We sing thanksgiving that Mission & Service is helping to improve the health of women and babies in Tanzania.
