THE DORY DROP-IN CENTRE KINCARDINE

The Canadian Mental Health Association(CHMA) Grey Bruce Branch has an office for mental health clients on the corner of Queen and Durham Sts. in Kincardine. CHMA, founded in 1918, is one of Canada's oldest voluntary associations and is the only one that deals with all aspects of mental health and illness. The Kincardine site offers counselling, every day living assistance and social support.

The Leisure Links Program is a social recreational program of the CHMA. This program provides opportunities for people with mental health issues to meet others in an informal, relaxed and friendly environment. Social interaction with others and assistance to connect with activities within the community is also available through the Leisure Links Program. This program started a drop-in centre known as the DORY at the corner of Queen St. and Durham St. Andrew Vavoid is the recreational director.

About 12 years ago two counsellors came to a Bruce Presbytery meeting and presented this program to our group. When asked what Bruce Presbytery could do to contribute to the program, we were asked to start a luncheon for clients attending the Dory. This would give them an opportunity to socialize with the people in Kincardine.

Our church started to do a monthly lunch in Nov 2007 by Lighthouse Unit (Unit 5). We also have several members from the Anglican Church and Presbyterian Church helping monthly. At first the numbers attending were small but have been growing steadily. We usually serve around 25 guests including our workers. A complete meal is served every month. The menu varies to include salads, casseroles, soup and sandwich, ham and scalloped potatoes, turkey and of course dessert. All the food is donated by members of the 3 churches participating. Guests may contribute to the food bank or make a donation. All donations are given to the food bank every year. We have become friends with our guests and we enjoy each others' company very much.

We would like to invite more members of our church to become part of this outreach. Please feel free to join us for lunch. Also donations of food and workers are always welcome. The menu is set the week before and emails are sent out requesting workers and food donations. Our lunches at noon are on the last Tues of each month. In Dec. it is held on the Friday when the hampers are distributed.

MINUTE FOR MISSIONS

NOVEMBER 5, 2017

A CHAPLAIN AND A CHURCH PLANTER

Our gifts for Mission & Service have supported training for ministers and building churches. Let us hear the story of one man who made a huge difference in many lives!

The Rev. Dr. Waldo Edward Lovel Smith was a United Church minister, author, navy chaplain, professor, and church planter who is remembered fondly by former students, veterans, ministers, and parishioners. The ripples of his commitment can be felt today.

During World War 2, Waldo was granted a leave from his pastoral charge in Grafton, Ontario, to serve as chaplain in the 1st Canadian Armoured Brigade in Canada, England, and Italy. He was awarded the Military Cross for rescuing John Matheson in 1943 while serving in Italy. Waldo carried John from where he lay on the ground to a field hospital. John Matheson is the man who helped Canada choose the flag design we love today.

After the war, while teaching at Queen's Theological College, Waldo used support grants to create many churches in the developing communities around Kingston, Ontario. One that is still a thriving congregation today is St. Andrew's By-The-Lake United Church. Waldo formed the congregation in a nearby school in 1951. With support from the Missionary and Maintenance Fund (now Mission & Service), the church was created in its current location with student minister leadership until 1957, when it called its first full-time ordained minister.

We sing thanksgiving for the giving hearts of those who have answered the call to chaplaincy.
