#### **MISSION SUNDAY**

Mission Sunday on Sunday, September 30<sup>th</sup> will feature David Epp as our guest speaker. David will be telling us about the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. We would like



to present David with a cheque toward the Foodgrains Bank ministry at the end of the service. As a result, we are raising money between now and then for that purpose. All donations should be made out to Kincardine United Church but marked "For Canadian Foodgrains Bank" so we can set your donation aside toward the cheque on September 30<sup>th</sup>. However, what do they do? Well....

In Malawi, farmers feel the effects of crop failure due to global climate change in ways that devastate their families. These farmers find increasingly unpredictable weather patterns – like prolonged drought and erratic rainfall – which makes producing a viable crop exceedingly difficult.

Danny Gwira, is just such a farmer. Before the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, his family was always short of food. They only ate maize and leafy vegetables like cabbage and pumpkin leaves. Danny had no energy to work on such an undernourished diet. However, after learning sustainable soil management techniques, he is now able to grow more and better food. Since receiving his training, Danny and his family have moved from being hungry to having extra food to sell – and all of this in eight short months.



When a farm family like Danny's can take their tiny, two-acre farm and transform it into land providing abundance, that is certainly a sign of making a difference in ways that touch lives.



#### MINUTE FOR MISSION

#### CARING FOR CHILDREN IN GAZA

Our gifts for Mission & Service support the Near East Council of Churches in caring for children in the midst of the shattered infrastructure of the Gaza Strip.

Of particular concern are children suffering from malnutrition and anemia, both treatable illnesses. The clinics in Shijaia, Darraj, and Rafah estimate anemia and malnutrition affect about 10,000 children in these areas from newborn infants to age six. If treated in time, 60 percent of the children will fully recover.

Parents and children are welcome to come to clinics, and the Near East Council of Churches also runs outreach programs for families who need services and can't get to clinics. In addition to the 10,000 children treated for illness, clinic staff will be able to carry out about 22,000 well baby checks per year. Children with more complicated diagnoses are referred to advanced diagnostic and therapeutic services.

The reality of living in the Gaza Strip is harsh. There are shortages of drugs. The Near East Council of Churches reports a shortfall of about 40 percent in essential drugs needed for mother and child health services. The exposure to health risks has increased, including the spread of communicable diseases, food insecurity, and psychosocial issues. The economic impact of the ongoing blockade and other factors means families have much more limited capacity to contribute to medical costs.

Mission & Service makes it possible for the Near East Council of Churches to address the challenges of providing medical care to children in the Gaza Strip.
