Today is Mission Sunday at Kincardine United Church, featuring David Epp as our guest speaker.



David will be telling us about the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. We are presenting David with a cheque toward their Foodgrains ministry at the end of the service collected from the donations the people of the church have contributed over the past two months. However, you can still donate and we will send a second cheque for the remaining amount in the mail to follow David's leadership in worship today. All donations should be made out to Kincardine United Church but marked "For Canadian Foodgrains Bank."

Here is a reminder of some of what they do....

In the Kindo Koysha District of Ethiopia, staff at the Terepeza Devlopment Association (TDA) are preaching the gospel - the gospel of conservation agriculture. The TDA is supported bv the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, sending out animators to gain converts to the different way of farming in the dry and hilly area about 360 kilometres



Mogise and Testaye are farmers who are learning to improve the fertility of their soil and increase their yields.

southwest of the capital of Addis Ababa. The TDA project is one of 11 across Ethiopia, Kenya and Tanzinia, which together make a lifesaving difference. Halfway through the programme, over 21,000 farmers practicing conservation agriculture are rewarded with better yields, less hunger and greater hope. "Where the land is deteriorated by lots of soil erosion, it is the only way to grow good crops," asserts Bereket Tassew, Director of TDA.



MINUTE FOR MISSION

SEPTEMBER 30, 2018

A PLACE TO FIND TANGIBLE HELP

Our gifts for Mission & Service support community ministries like Back Door Mission in Oshawa, Ontario.

Adrian, Sherri, and their young daughter are just three of the people whose lives have been changed by the ministry of the Back Door Mission. When Adrian lost his job due to a work injury in 2015, his disability payments were inadequate to the challenge of providing for his family. After Adrian and Sherri's mortgage foreclosed and they lost their home, they turned to a homeless shelter and then emergency housing before being forced to live in their car.

At risk of losing their child for violating the regulations of the Children's Aid Society, the couple agreed that the mother and daughter would move into a local women's shelter. While this family has faced crisis after crisis, with the support of Back Door Mission it is finally finding ways to navigate the social assistance network.

For more than 20 years, Back Door Mission has helped to relieve the burdens of poverty and social dislocation experienced by those living in economically depressed circumstances in Oshawa. Over 100 people come to the doors of its downtown facility every day.

Its drop-in centre offers a welcoming space three afternoons a week where people can find shelter, companionship, and a snack or light meal. Says Don MacLeod, chair of the board, "The drop-in program provides an opportunity for community within a socially disconnected and often stigmatized population, and a place to find tangible help. This is a place where the poor, generally physically or mentally disabled in some form, can find friends and the experience of belonging."
