ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE LAND

We are privileged to live on this land that originally was inhabited by the Saugeen Ojibwa and Odawa peoples who, in faith, signed treaty 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ in 1936. This treaty had the Saugeen Ojibwa and Odawa people surrender 1.5 million acres of prime land, and agree to move to either Manitoulin Island or up to their territory north of Owen Sound, where houses would be built for them.

They were also promised assistance to not only become civilized (the word actually used in the treaty) but assistance to cultivate the land, and that they would be forever protected from encroachment by the settlers.

This treaty was not only broken but did not honour the wisdom or culture of the Ojibwa and Odawa peoples.

It is time for us, through intentional listening and learning, to not only build trust but to build a respectful, friendly, peaceful relationship with the Saugeen Nation, our relations. This will be a seven generational process amd requires patience and intention. May it be so.

Jesus Calls the First Disciples

5 Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, ² he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. ³ He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. ⁴ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." ⁵ Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." ⁶ When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. ⁷ So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them.
